

# **ALL ABOARD THE ZOL TRAIN!**

On July 5, 2017, Sorors from the United States and abroad arrived at the JW Marriott in Washington, DC to officially board the 2017 ZOL Train. Prior to arriving, 2017 ZOL participants read the book The 3600 Leader: Developing the Leader within You by John C. Maxwell and participated in webinar Book Reviews.

The participants attended workshops specifically designed to assist and inspire them to become 3600 Leaders, including: Do You Have Your Boarding Pass (Legal Matters), Don't Get Left on the Tracks (Time Management), How to Handle the Crossroads (Sections 5



& 6 of The 360°Leader); How to Stay on the Train (ZOL Requirements), The Evolution of the Structure, Function and Process of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, How to Keep the Tracks Connected (Sisterhood Inclusion), How to Keep the Train from Derailing (Conflict Resolution); How to Keep the Train Moving (Motivation), and How to Switch the Tracks Successfully (Risk Management).

Each ZOL registrant received a customized leadership self-assessment based on the five Executive Core Qualities (ECQs - Leading Change, Leading People, Results Driven, Business Acumen, and Building Coalitions) and the Fundamental Competencies (Interpersonal Skills, Oral Communication, Integrity/Honesty, Written Communication, Continual Learning and Public Service Motivation). As a follow-up to the selfassessment, Dr. Linda Brown, consultant with Management Concepts, provided insight to strengthen their ECQs.

Additional speakers included Soror Karen Arrington who provided words of wisdom on leadership, Actress

and writer Kim Coles who talked with participants about "G.I.F.T.S" and Past Grand Basileus Dr. Barbara West Carpenter, who provided a lively session on Running for a Political Office.

The training concluded with International Grand Basileus Dr. Mary Breaux Wright with an inspirational charge to keep moving forward. In addition to the workshops, Grand Wright extended an invitation for Sorors to tour our newly renovated National Headquarters. Sorors were also able to get their Passports stamped with a special house stamp.

# 2017 National Undergraduate Retreat

Undergraduates joined together to engage in the 2017 National Undergraduate Retreat. This year, the retreat was organized and hosted by Soror Andrea Buckley, National Undergraduate Member-at-Large. The goal and vision for the retreat was based on a passage of scripture that is near and dear to our Sisterhood, Proverbs 31:10-31. The theme for the retreat was "I AM: Faith. Finer. Fearless."



Day One of the retreat involved a private 1920's themed tea party and

viewing of National Headquarters. Dressed in 1920's fashion, the 30 undergraduates received a tour led by Grand Wright. The visit ended with a Phireside Chat, where the undergraduates could truly ask any question they desired. The evening concluded with four personal development workshops, focusing on Fear, Faith, Confidence and Self-Worth.

During Day Two, the undergraduates engaged in an intense all-day series of professional development workshops. Topics including chapter management; undergraduate and graduate relations; fundraising; the visual identity guide; accountability; and service.

## 2017 Zeta Amicae Leadership Development Retreat

Forty-seven Amicae and sponsors joined the Zeta Amicae Leadership Train for the 2017 Zeta Amicae Leadership Development Retreat.The focus of this Leadership Retreat was "Back to Basics." Topics includedThe ABC's of What You Should Know; Lollipop Leadership; The FISH! Philosophy; and What Makes a Successful Auxiliary President-Member-Committees. The Zeta Amicae Networking Luncheon focused on the "Year of the Amicae" activities from all eight regions.



### They also conducted a Z-HOPE

Service Project where they participated with the Central Union Mission's "Fresh Start Program."Zeta Amicae presented \$1,000 and 56 boxes/bags of personal care items for homeless men and women.

Other activities included a Tour of the National Museum of African American History and Culture, and a Chat with Grand Wright and tour at National Headquarters. The Amicae were very excited to tour the Zeta House with the Grand and meet the Headquarters staff.

A dozen outstanding young ladies, six Amicettes and six Archonettes, represented Zeta Youth Auxiliaries at ZOL 2017. Boarding the ZOL 2017 train were Archonettes Troylanda Bachus, Kayla Dotson, Kemoya Latimore, Jasmyn Murray, Alexus Smith, and Alyssa Wilson.

Navarro, Madison Neal, and Leah Pollard. ZOL 2017 exposed Zeta youth to interactive leadership development sessions with Zeta content experts and two cultural experiences. The activities began Thursday with a tour of DC at night, which included an exciting ride on the Washington Metro and photo ops at Union Station, Arlington National Cemetery, Martin Luther King National Memorial, and the Lincoln Memorial.

On Friday, the first workshop involved an etiquette lesson conducted during a tea party held at National Headquarters. With navy hats, lacy white gloves, and pearls in place, the youth were led on a tour by Grand Wright; experienced photo ops in the courtyard; and received a special commemorative stamp and pen. On day two, the youth toured the Department of Interior, including a visit to the South Penthouse Rooftop Terrance and the Interior Department Museum. The youth also participated in a Q&A in the Director's Conference Room with the Fish and Wild Life leadership team.

## 2017 State Directors Retreat

Twenty-three State Directors attended the State Directors' retreat to enhance their skills. Survey data was used to ensure that the sessions were on the topics that the State Directors would find valuable. The Grand met with the State Directors to address several important operational and programmatic issues. The other sessions held over the twoday period were State Director/Life Balance: Transitioning My Life After State Director; Establishing Your State Director Presence; presentation skills; Zeta's insurance program; conflict resolution; and investigations. In addition to these on-site sessions, the



State Directors will participate in webinars to enhance their knowledge regarding event planning, technology and fundraising/grant writing.

It is our pleasure to inform you of scheduled events to commemorate the Founder, unique to the Southeastern Region of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated.

The commemoration is a four-phased project. The first phase is the dedication of a museum shadow box display in Founder Watts' birth town of Perry, Georgia. This will occur on September 30, 2017, and is coordinated by Georgia's State Director, Soror Shaneesa Ashford. The invitation and registration for this event is already out.

Phases two through four will occur as precursors to the 83rd Southeastern Regional Leadership Conference; held November 9 – 12, 2017, Hilton Head Marriott Resort and Spa, One Hotel Circle, Hilton Head, SC. Set to occur on November 8, 2017, these phases consist of the unveiling of historical markers on the campus of Savannah State University, and the city of Savannah.

Individuals interested in attending the event or staying over for the Leadership Conference, may make reservations at the Hilton Head Marriott resort and Spa, 843-686-8400.

Founder Watts, was born in Perry. Georgia to Attorney Foster Pettie and Fannie Pettie. She attended public schools in Savannah, Georgia and continued her formal training at Georgia State College, now known as Savannah State University. She later graduated from Howard University with a Bachelor of Arts in Education.

As many of our sister regions have done, the Southeastern Region, its state Directors, Executive Board, and membership are marking their Journey to Centennial with events to honor its birth founder. However, the journey and events, would not be complete without providing an opportunity for chapters, states, and regions to be identified on the historical markers.

## GRAND WRIGHT RECEIVES IMAGE AWARD FROM BETA ALPHA XI ZETA; VISITS GRAVESITE OF 7TH GRAND BASILEUS FANNIE R. GIVENS

Beta Alpha Xi Zeta Chapter of Louisville, KY held its Inaugural Zeta IMAGE Awards on June 24, 2017. The Special Honoree was Dr. Mary Breaux Wright, International Grand Basileus. The inaugural Zeta IMAGE Awards cohort included Senator Gerald Anthony Neal, District 33; Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer; Councilwoman Jessica Green, District 1; Diane Porter, Jefferson County Board of Education Member, District 1; and Sadiqa Reynolds, President and CEO of the Louisville Urban League.

During her trip to Louisville, Grand Wright visited the gravesite of 7th Grand Basileus Fannie R. Givens and placed 12 white roses. Grand Wright was escorted by Keisha D. Smith, Kentucky State Director, and Beta Alpha Xi Zeta Chapter members Jerrica Mayes, Alissa Nannie and Rachel T. Smith.





Past Grand Givens, a member of Eta Zeta Chapter, was elected Grand Basileus for two terms, 1930 – 1933. Her administration was marked by the important decentralization of administrative responsibility, including the grouping of chapters into geographical regions and appointments of Regional Directors. Past Grand Givens was also the mother of Fannie O'Bannon, who served as the 3rd Grand Basileus of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated, from 1927 – 1931. The mother and daughter served as Grand Basileus of their respective organizations concurrently.



Past Grand Givens was a law enforcement officer and one of the first African American women to be hired by the Louisville Police Department. She rests in the Eastern Cemetery with her husband, James Edward Givens, who was the second president for State Normal School for Colored Person (SNSCP), known today as the Kentucky State University.
